Waco Police Chief Sheryl D. Victorian, Ph.D.

Chief Sheryl Victorian is a native Texan and a 28-year police professional. She was sworn in as Waco Police Chief on March 15, 2021, after retiring as an Assistant Chief from the Houston Police Department. As an Assistant Chief, she led the Patrol Region 2 Command consisting of five Patrol Divisions, and Vehicular Crimes Division. Her law enforcement career also includes assignments in the Major Offenders, Homicide, Special Victims, Internal Affairs, Training, and Patrol.

As the Chief of Police for the City of Waco, Chief Victorian oversees the largest police department in Central Texas, with 24/7, 365 days a year responsibilities. Her agency is comprised

of 266 sworn police officers and just under 100 civilian support staff.

Chief Victorian has earned many awards and commendations for her service and dedication as a police professional. She was recognized as the 100 Club of Houston's "Rookie Officer of the Year" in 1995, and earned a Life Saving Award, an Award of Excellence, Chief Unit Citations, and many Citizen and Chief of Police commendations. She holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Administration of Justice from Texas Southern University, a Master of Science Degree in Criminal Justice from the University of Houston – Downtown, and a Doctor of Philosophy Degree in Administration of Justice from Texas Southern University.

Waco Fire Chief Gregory Summers

Chief Gregory Summers was confirmed on March 17, 2020, as Fire Chief of Waco Fire & Rescue-Waco, Texas, and begin serving March 30, 2020, managing a workforce of 204 Civil Service employees and 6 civilians. He retired from the Little Rock Fire Department in 2018 after 34 years of service. He served in many capacities within the Little Rock Fire Department most notably the last nine years as the Fire Chief-Little Rock's First African American to serve in that post. During his tenure, the LRFD would achieve a distinction only held by eighty-seven fire departments in the United States.

There are approximately 30,000 fire departments in the United States and Little Rock is one of eighty-seven that are both ISO Class I and holds the prestigious "Accreditation Standard" from the Commission on Fire Accreditation International a feat that represents less than 1% of fire departments with this achievement.

Chief Summers is also proud of increasing the diversity within the department during his tenure. Chief Summers is a member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity Inc and has been married to his lovely wife Jeannette for 35-years. He has three adult children and three grandchildren. He holds a BS degree in Emergency Management and an AAS degree in Fire Science.
